WHAT IS IT?

Shift all major uses to electric:

- Home space & water heating
- Transport
- Cooking

40% of US carbon emissions come from lite-duty vehicles and homes.

If we switch everything to electricity, we will use 40% of the energy we do today.



WHAT IS IT?

Thinking creatively about our consumption of material goods and materialistic culture

It would take 5 Earths for everyone to live like Americans do.



WHAT IS IT?

It is necessary to embark on a generational building project - new sources of energy (wind, solar), better buildings and homes (more efficient, smaller), and walkable communities

 Households in transitoriented neighborhoods use
 60% of the energy compared to conventional suburban development.



- Replace gas furnace with heat pump
- Replace gas water heater with heat pump WH
- For whom public transit and biking are not feasible, replace ICE cars with electric
- Lower food waste
- Plant-based diet
- Use public transit and bike
- Insulate home
- Buy quality, repairable items or buy used
- Avoid exposure to advertising
- Add an ADU
- Add solar
- Support renewable on/near your community



- Electrify PMC!
- Electrify your local school or recreation center
- Organize inter-church lending
- Church "Repair" saturdays, where we bring in clothes in need of mending and learn from our master repairers
- Advocate for e-bike lending library in your town or workplace
- Advocate for local school to adopt meatless mondays
- Church Parking lot housing development?
- Advocate for Zoning reform to allow multifamily housing
- Advocate for local bike path
